

- Are nonetheless directionally aligned and insightful



The Value of Business Architecture


Strategy Execution, Business and IT Alignment, Transformation, Decision-Making, and Initiative Planning top the list of our big whys.



Business Architecture Pain Points


The top pain points for business architecture are human and change related: (1) understanding and buy-in and (2) integration with others.

By when do you predict business architecture will be adopted by a solid majority of individuals within your organization?¹



Our Business Architecture Advocates


Transformation, Strategy, and Technology Leaders are key advocates and the value proposition of business architecture serves them well.





Key Business Architecture Partnerships


Strategy, EA/IT Architecture, and Program/Project Management top the list of our key partnerships to build.

Business Architecture Domains Leveraged


Capabilities are unquestionably the centerpiece of business architecture and value streams are rapidly becoming a necessary complement. Familiarity or fluency with other domains is important as organizations mature.





Business Architecture Tool Support


The ability to deliver a robust business architecture vision and value proposition requires an automated tool and the level of tool support available to teams is questionable and in many cases insufficient.

Business Architecture Team Reporting


"All business architecture teams report to IT" is a myth and the numbers continue to increase towards teams reporting to the business (or between business and IT).

Business Architecture Team Structure


~Half of business architecture teams are centralized with another ~quarter of them structured as a hybrid.

Business Architecture Team Size


The majority of business architecture teams (~88% here) are small, with 20 or fewer business architects.

In the majority of cases, the business architect role is formalized or there is an awareness that it should be (or an intent to create it at some point).


Is the business architect role formalized within your organization?¹





Life Before Business Architecture


The Business Analyst role still provides a strong pool for future business architects – but business architects can come from anywhere.

Seeing the big picture, connecting dots, and business perspective top the list of unique traits for business architects.




Business Architect Strengths

Many business architects (but not all, each individual is unique) desire most and are best suited for applying business architecture. Building the knowledgebase and practice are often enjoyed less.




Business Architecture Practice Priorities

The top priorities for practices this year are delivering value, socializing business architecture, establishing a new practice, and creating a baseline.



Business Architecture Non-Negotiables

Strategy execution positioning and the use of capabilities tops the list of business architecture non-negotiables.



Business Architecture Non-Negotiables


Whynde's List of Non-Negotiables

- Capabilities are a necessary construct to help organizations organize and optimize the resources needed to deliver stakeholder value and execute change initiatives. They should provide a non-redundant view.
- Capabilities alone are not enough and need a **flow- or value-based construct to provide context for their usage**. The Guild calls these value streams. Capabilities and value streams are particularly powerful when related to and used in conjunction with each other.
- The **scope of an organization's business architecture** should represent the entire organization and the ecosystem in which it operates. We have plenty of fragmented views of our organizations. Business architecture helps us see the whole.
- The **scope of business architecture** = the 10 domains defined by the Guild. This also provides sharp clarity on how business architecture relates to other disciplines.
- The **focus and positioning** of business architecture is between strategy and execution. Business architecture informs and translates strategy into a coordinated set of actions across an organization.




Who Should Use Business Architecture
